



We are excited to share that Lake Carroll is a winner of the ComEd and Openlands Green Region program to help support our Lake Carroll Water Conservation and Pollinator Habitat Initiative.

This project is designed to provide water quality improvements through the use of native vegetation. This is a highly visible public space that is just past the south west corner of the clubhouse parking lot. It will bring awareness of the need of pollinator plants for overall environmental health to a large number of visitors annually.

Lake Manager Joe Rush and the Lake Carroll Prairie Club have worked closely together to secure this grant and make this project a reality. This area is also home to the federally endangered Rusty Patched Bumblebee. This initiative is expected to help create additional habitat for this critical species, as well as benefiting other pollinator animals and insects. Lake Carroll was lucky enough to be one of the 26 public agencies to receive this grant. We would like to thank ComEd and Openlands for this honor.
